

## Consecutive Diploma Program

For those NSS, SA or EQ diplomates whose workload and professional interest makes a dual diploma (SA and EQ) advantageous, the Committee proposes these requirements to credential for the track of interest. Once the initial (NSS, SA or EQ) diploma has been earned, the diplomate works to meet the following pre-set standards for case log requirements and other activities relevant to the 'additional' species track via an Equine or Small Animal *approved residency site/program* for the track of interest. The respective SA or EQ Credentials Committee would review the credentials package, and if approved, the diplomate would be permitted to take the AVDC certifying examination in the 'additional track'. If s/he passes the examination, s/he will be board-certified in the additional track.

### **Requirements for Additional SA or Equine Credentials Submission:**

**\*\*Only fully recognized AVDC Diplomates in either SA or Equine may apply.\*\***

The respective specialty track Credentials Committee will be responsible for reviewing the Diplomate's credentials package.

**Suggested Certifying Examination Requirements for Consecutive Diploma:**

Same as current AVDC certifying examination requirements for the respective specialty track.

## Combined Residency Program

Residents are registered in both the Equine and the Small Animal residency tracks at the same time at Equine and Small Animal *approved residency sites/programs*. Both the SA and EQ Credentials Committee review the credentials package in a joint manner. A review subcommittee will be made of 2 small animal and 2 equine Diplomates, and the Chairs of the respective Committees will work cooperatively to move materials to the subcommittees and make final decisions. Species-specific material will be reviewed by the respective species Diplomates in the subcommittees. All four members of the subcommittee and the respective Credentials Chairs will review the entirety of the package for a final credentials decision. A similar joint Training Support Committee will review annual reports.

If a resident decides to quit the dual program and transfer to a single-track program, all requirements for that track will apply. Species-specific cases and materials can be transferred and counted for the single-track program as long as they comply with all written standards for that species-specific program. The items already pre-approved will be transferred, and species specific MRCL time limits will apply to log entries.

**Suggested Certifying Examination Requirements for Combined Residency:**

- AVDC certifying examinations for both the SA and Equine tracts will need to be taken in separate years.
- For each certifying examination track, the same current AVDC certifying examination requirements apply.

MRCL Guidelines:

1. There can be no double counting of cases between species or categories.
2. Unless otherwise stated, all MRCL rules for the Equine and SA tracts apply.
3. There are a minimum number of cases for Equine and SA per category for the Combined Residency MRCL. For categories (PE1, PE3, PE4, EN1, EN2, EN3, RE, PR, OR3, OR4) where the minimums for Equine and SA don't add up to the required final number, equine cadavers, other species, or additional in vivo Equine/SA cases can be utilized to reach the final required number.
4. Five cadaver cases can be used to substitute for an Equine or Small Animal minimum requirement in PE1, PE3, PE4, EN1, EN2, EN3, RE, PR, OR3, OR4. These cases will need to have accompanying cadaver forms and follow all AVDC guidelines for cadaver supplementation.
